Bring Your Family to Enjoy the Library's Newly-Opened Teen Center

Payson Library celebrated their **Teen Technology and Gaming Space** opening on Tuesday, May 29—a unique, supervised center where kids can come and enjoy a great variety of gaming options. Special guests at the grand opening ceremony included Michele Reagan, Secretary of State, and Craig Swartwood, Payson mayor. The ribbon cutting was completed by Kajal Daya, President of the Payson area Advisory Youth Council. Approximately 45 parents and kids attended the opening and enjoyed the refreshments served—pizza, pop, chips, fruit, and cookies!

The center is available to kids ages 10 – 18 during regular Library hours and offers computer games as well as console games. Available are 6 gaming computers, a 55 in. flat screen TV, an Xbox One console that provides 6 gaming options, and 9 Nintendo switch games—all rated “everyone to teen ratings.” The Teen Center monitoring is possible due its many windows that provide high visibility. In addition, a security camera will be connected to the Internet so that activity can be monitored at the reference desk and computer firewalls also work to block undesirable content.



Library Director, Emily Linkey, wrote the grant along with several staff members who contributed to its vision, including David Grasse, Danielle Hirepan, and Timothy Branson. The \$15,000 Library Services and Technology Act grant is federally funded through the Institute of Museum and Library Services and administered by the Arizona State Library and Archives. Thank you, staff, for a very fine additional service for our Library patrons!

September 17, 2018

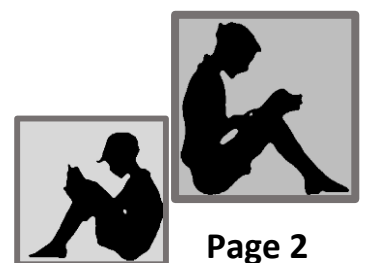
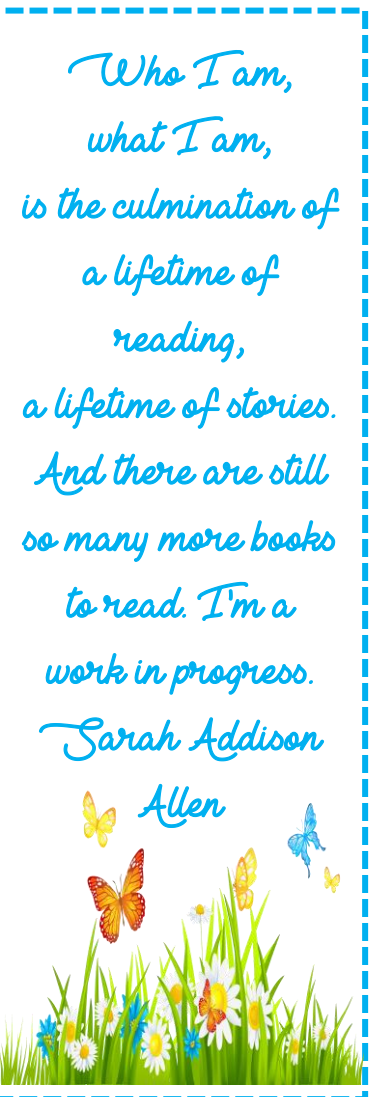

Rim Readers Discuss *Mrs. Lincoln's Dressmaker* at June 20 Meeting

"The help" knows you better than anybody. Elizabeth Keckley knew the Lincolns as people, as husband and wife, as parents, as residents of the White House, as the most important members of the social circle in Washington D.C. during the War between the States. She pinned and stitched beautiful silk gowns for Mary Todd as her husband, Abe, threw his long legs over a chair and chit chatted with "Mother" over the events of the day.

Judy Herbolzheimer asked members to consider two women in this book: one, Mary Todd Lincoln, a first lady of history who is known mostly by her flaws, known to be mentally unstable, but also a mother who lost three sons, was never really accepted by society, but also who seemed to be politically astute, and secondly, Elizabeth Keckley: a slave woman who purchased her own freedom, who started a very profitable business, became the most sought after dressmaker in Washington, accepted a faculty position at Wilberforce University, and wrote a book about her employer and close friend, Mary Todd. Below is pictured the now famous quilt Mrs. Keckley made of scraps from the dresses she had sewn for Mrs. Lincoln.

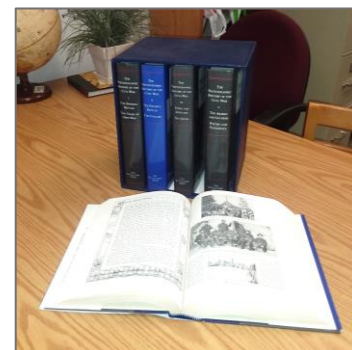

As for staffing, many of you know that Elaine Baca who has served for 2 years as our IT and Technical Services Specialist is moving to Prescott. Her last day was Wednesday, June 13th. We all wish Elaine and her husband well and I am excited to announce a return of an old friend to fill her shoes. Timothy Branson, who left us last summer to pursue his education, is back in Payson and will start as our new full time IT and Technical Services Specialist. Savannah Barr, who coincidentally replaced Timothy Branson last year, has been promoted to a position as Graphic Designer at the Payson Parks and Recreation Department. We've moved Kylea Donaldson up into her position and Kylea is doing a wonderful job. The position of circulation page, which Kylea previously held, is currently vacant. Applications for this position closed June 7, and we will begin the interview process shortly.

DVDs are now being shelved in a file cabinet instead of the white binders. This new system seems to be working quite well. One nice feature is that the new shelving can hold up to 9,000 DVDs, which will almost double our inventory. Feedback from our volunteers is that the DVDs are more accessible and readily visible making it much easier to find a specific DVD.

The new, upgraded security cameras have been installed by Aztec Alarm and are exceeding expectations. They display in color and the clarity is exceptional helping us provide better security to all areas of the Library.

Other exciting changes coming to the Payson Library this summer? New carpet, a new HVAC condensing unit, and of course, our already successful Teen/ Tween Technology and Gaming Space. If you don't make it to the library this summer, you may not recognize us come fall. Thanks to all of our Library Friends who continue to help us grow and expand services to the community.

Community and Library – A Shared Future!

Romaine Brophy shares her Washington, D.C. adventures . . .

Our very own **Romaine Brophy** was the featured speaker for the June LFOP General Meeting. Romaine provided a very informative and entertaining presentation on her trip to Washington, DC taken in October 2017 with Road Scholar Tours.

Romaine explained that Washington, DC, the capital of the USA, is technically a Federal District. It is not part of any state, has no Senator and only one Representative. Established in 1798, Washington, DC is part of the National Park System, and the National Mall is considered to be “America’s Main Street.”

Romaine spent five days touring with a group of 40. She shared many of her photos and had interesting stories to share about the various monuments and museums she visited, among many were:

- Vietnam Veterans Memorial, dedicated in 1982 – contains 58,318 names (including eight women) who died in Vietnam from June 8, 1956 to May 15, 1975
- Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial, dedicated 2011
- National Museum of American History (in the Smithsonian Institute Complex), opened in 1964 as the Museum of History and Technology, renamed in 1980
- National Museum of Natural History (also part of the Smithsonian Institute Complex), opened in 1910
- Air and Space Museum, opened 1976 – it is the most visited museum in the US
- National Gallery of Art, opened in 1941 – contains art from the Middle Ages to the present day
- United States Capitol Building, the original building opened in 1800, then partially burned in 1812
- Library of Congress, established in 1800 by John Adams, contains the original library of Thomas Jefferson
- White House, completed in 1800, burned by the British in 1814, rebuilt in 1817 – named the “White House” by President Theodore Roosevelt.



Romaine and her group were also fortunate to visit the Embassy of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. She added the trip was a wonderful learning experience and she would not hesitate to visit again.
